

## Travel directions to the institute


To get around Prague we recommend using public transport, which is very efficient, reliable, safe and inexpensive. We recommend taking taxi only if you miss the last bus from the airport terminal 2 at 23:34.

### Airport to Institute of Physics

From the airport take bus number **119** all the way till the terminal stop **Dejvická**. The buses leave every 7-10 minutes, the last two ones are at 23:16 and 23:34. There change to subway line **A** (green color) and go to **Museum**, where you should change to line **C** and exit at the **Ládví** stop. The whole trip should take about 60 minutes and you need single ticket for 32 CZK. From Ládví subway stop follow the instructions below.

### Ládví to Institute of Physics

It takes about 7 min by walk. There are many possible routes you can take. The address of the entrance is **Pod vodárenskou věží 1, Praha 8**. It is best to follow the map below.



**At the institute**

Upon arriving to the institute you are likely to be stopped by the doormen. You should tell him that you are coming for the workshop, your name should be on the list that he will have and should let you in. On Wednesday afternoon and Friday all day, we will be in a big lecture hall immediately to the left of the entrance. On Wednesday morning and on Thursday we will be in the room 117 one floor above the entrance.

**Note about public transport tickets:**

32 CZK are good for 90 minutes, 24 CZK tickets for 30 minutes, both with unlimited changes. Children below 6 years are free, between 6-10 pay half the price. Tickets can be bought from the automatic machines, public transport offices or newspaper shops. They must be validated before entering the pay zone. The frequent unmerciful ticket controllers enjoy checking especially foreigners. We do not particularly recommend the 24h or 72 hour tickets (110/310 CZK) as they usually do not pay off.
